Book or pamphlet two or three authors/editors	<p>Last Name of first author/editor listed, First Name, and Next author/editor first name and last name. <u>Title</u>. City of Publication: Publisher, Year of Publication. Medium of Publication.</p> <p>EXAMPLE: Searles, John, Kate Jones, and Martin Smith. <u>A Reader's Guide to Science Fiction</u>. New York: Washington Square Press, 1972. Print.</p>
Book or pamphlet with more than three authors or editors	<p>Last Name of first author/editor listed, First Name, et al. <u>Title</u>. City of Publication: Publisher, Year of Publication. Medium of Publication.</p> <p>EXAMPLE: Brawley, Kathleen, et al., eds. <u>Vanishing Species</u>. New York: Time Life Books, 1977. Print.</p>
A single work from an anthology	<p>Author last name, First name. "Title of Work." <u>Title of the Anthology</u>. Ed. Editor's first and last name. City of Publication: Publisher, Year of Publication. Page numbers of the cited piece. Medium of Publication.</p> <p>EXAMPLE: Poe, Edgar Allen. "The Raven." <u>Selected Stories & Poems</u>. Ed. Joseph Wood Kruth. Danbury: Grolier Enterprises, 1975. 221-5. Print.</p>
ARTICLES:	
Reference Book (Encyclopedia/ Dictionary)	<p>"Title of Article." <u>Title of Encyclopedia</u>. Edition (if stated). Year of Publication. Medium of Publication.</p> <p>EXAMPLE: "Falcon and Falconry." <u>World Book Encyclopedia</u>. 4th Edition. 1980. Print.</p>
Magazine	<p>Author last name, First name. "Title of Article." <u>Title of Publication</u> Complete date of publication beginning with the day and abbreviating the month except for May, June, July and then followed by the year: page numbers of article. Medium of Publication.</p> <p>EXAMPLE: Kanfer, Stefan. "Heard Any Good Books Lately?" <u>Time</u> 21 Oct. 1998: 71-75. Print.</p>

<p>Newspaper</p>	<p>Author last name, First name. "Title of Article." <u>Name of Newspaper</u>. Complete date of publication beginning with the day and abbreviating the month except for May, June, July and then followed by the year: Section of newspaper in which the article is found and page numbers. Medium of Publication.</p> <p>Note: Newspaper articles are often not printed on consecutive pages --- for example, an article might begin on page 1, then skip to page 17. For such articles, write only the first page number and a plus sign, leaving no space between.</p> <p>EXAMPLE: Kalette, Denise. "California Town Counts Down to Big Quake." <u>USA Today</u> 21 July 2005: C1+. Print</p> <p>-----</p> <p>If you are citing from a local newspaper, include the city name in brackets after the title of the newspaper.</p> <p>EXAMPLE: Smith, Robert. "Teams take honors at state Odyssey." <u>The Trumbull Times</u> [Trumbull, CT] 10 June 2010: A16. Print.</p>

<p>Web Site</p>	<p>Author last name, First name. "Title of Work." <u>Title of Website</u>. Publisher of Site, Date of Publication. Medium of Publication. Date of Access.</p> <p>EXAMPLE: Wiles, Andrew. "Solving Fermat: Andrew Wiles." <u>NOVA Online</u>. PBS. Org, Nov. 2000. Web. 8 June 2010.</p>
<p>Database</p>	<p>Author last name, First name. "Title of Article." <u>Name of Periodical</u> Volume Number (for scholarly journal) Date (for scholarly journals include the year in parentheses): Inclusive Page Numbers. <u>Title of Database</u>. Medium of Publication. Date of Access.</p> <p>EXAMPLE: Chon, Margaret, and Donna E. Arzt. "Walking While Muslim." <u>Law and Contemporary Problems</u> 68.2 (2005): 215+. <u>General One File</u>. Web. 3 May 2010.</p>

<p>Interview</p>	<p>Last name of person interviewed, First name. Type of interview. Date of interview.</p> <p>Note: Types of interview include Personal interview, Telephone interview, E-mail interview.</p> <p>EXAMPLE: Mahoney, Edward. Telephone interview. 9 August 2007.</p>
